# Food Collection for the Montrose VA Food Pantry...

On Saturday, October 4<sup>th</sup>, 2014 from 9 AM to 1 PM our Yorktown Post will once again hold a food collection to benefit the veterans who rely on the Montrose VA Food Pantry to survive. This is our 8<sup>th</sup> year conducting this important collection and everyone leaves with a warm feeling after we fill the Montrose Food Pantry van. Legionnaires set up tables in front of the A&P Supermarkets in Shrub Oak and Yorktown and collect non-perishable food items for just 4 hours that morning. We ask people entering to pick-up an item or two to donate to the veterans using the VA Food Pantry. The real story is when they come out of the store. People come out with bags and carts of food to donate for the veterans. Many donors tell us stories of their family members who have served, or are serving now. This really is a 'feel good' event and we hope everyone will help with this work that morning or come by and help with a donation.

We need a minimum of four people at each location to allow for emergencies and comfort breaks. More is always better and it gives every member a chance to get to know their fellow Post members. Why should you do There are many Posts in Westchester County and across the country whose membership consists of 80-90% WWII veterans. These Posts didn't offer a warm welcome to newer, younger veterans when they came home from their service. Now those aging Posts are reducing their activity and are in real danger of collapsing from the lack of new members. Our Yorktown Post is lucky to have a broad mix of war eras in our membership today. We have 22 members from WWII, 29 served during Korea, 63 during Vietnam, 6 during Grenada/Lebanon, 2 during Panama, and 4 during the Persian Gulf/ War on Terror period. Our Post has embraced new ideas from our younger members and we function better because of these ideas like our website, E-Newsletter, and WiFi service at the Post. While we modernized to attract younger veterans we never forgot our older members during these updates. Newsletter is mailed to our non-email using members and we still have our 'Current Events' board on the wall in the bar where our upcoming events are posted for all to see without a computer.

Our Yorktown Post is now involved in so many activities each year that there is literally something for everyone's interests. While we are at these events or our meetings there is information to benefit veterans of all eras exchanged.
